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School Data

Due to COVID-19, the State Department of Education waived state testing. Third year students were able to take SAT and ACT for college readiness. Third year students took the WIN test in the Fall of 2020 their fourth year for Career Readiness. The graduation rate for 2019-2020 is 84.8% which is above the state average. Through the use of Title 1 funds, remediation is being provided to students and resources are being provided to teachers to assist them in making up deficits due to students being out because of the pandemic.
