 - Implement parent/community nights/meetings—Title I Planning Meetings, Open House, Community Connection Luncheon with pastors/community members, PTO, variety of workshops, volunteer opportunities, home visits, parent conferences, and other family activities.
 - Sign a Title I Parent-Student-Teacher Compact to promise to work together to improve teaching and learning.
 - Provide a Suggestion Box in the front office & respond in a timely fashion (within the grading period) to suggestions through:
 - School website, Remind101 usage, telephone calls, emails, personal notes, flyers, School Messenger, etc.
 - CBHS "Paw Prints" newsletter and "Respect and Responsibility" newsletter (monthly parenting tips)
 - Survey our parents, students, and teachers for input to increase parent/community involvement.
 - Involve parents/community in School Improvement, Career Day, Job Shadowing, cultural events, field trips, business partners, Prom, graduation, etc.
- III. To share responsibility for high expectations for students, Carvers Bay High will:**
- Share and explain the school/district report cards to show progress and individual state and district test results through:
 - Family nights, Title I Meetings, PTO, open house, parent conferences, home visits, SIC,
 - Email, school and district websites, newsletters.
 - Sending home by students.
 - Explain the curriculum, standards, classroom /homework expectations, and assessments through:
 - PTO/Open House, family nights, grade level meetings.
 - Georgetown County Student Handbook.
 - Parent-Student-Teacher Compact.
 - Newsletters, district/school websites, teacher web pages, emails, etc
 - Provide on-going reports of student performance through progress reports, interims, report cards, Parent Portal, and teacher's web page on the school website, parent-teacher conferences, emails, Individual Graduation Plan, etc.
 - Provide parents with strategies to help with class work/homework/parenting through "The Paw Prints" newsletter, websites, "Respect and Responsibilities" newsletters, academic conferences, workshops, phone calls, emails, etc.

 - Report cards, interims, and progress reports.

 - District/school websites and teacher web pages.
 - Parent Portal and School Messenger.
 - Parents and community will continue to serve on the Title I committee, PTO board, and School Improvement Council.
